

Portion Guide for 1-4 year olds



Type of food?	How many portions?	Portion size?
Carbohydrate	1 portion at every meal	80g <i>(with some exceptions)</i>
Dairy	3 portions every day	Cheese = 15g / Yogurts = 60g
Fruit & Vegetables	5 portions every day	40g <i>(with some exceptions)</i>
Protein	2 portions every day	40-50g
Snacks	Not daily	Limited sugary snacks
Water	6 glasses every day	150ml

Choose foods lower in fat, salt and sugars

Water, lower fat milk, sugar-free drinks including tea and coffee all count.

Limit fruit juice and/or smoothies to a total of 150ml a day.

Eat at least 5 portions of a variety of fruit and vegetables every day

Fruit and vegetables



Eat less often and in small amounts

Choose wholegrain or higher fibre versions with less added fat, salt and sugar

Potatoes, bread, rice, pasta and other starchy carbohydrates



Beans, pulses, fish, eggs, meat and other proteins

Eat more beans and pulses, 2 portions of sustainably sourced fish per week, one of which is oily. Eat less red and processed meat



Dairy and alternatives

Choose lower fat and lower sugar options



Choose unsaturated oils and use in small amounts
